

REXASAURUS WAGON MASTER GUIDELINES

Every member of the Rexasaurus RV club is expected to volunteer as the Wagon Master or Co-Wagon Master at least once every two years. When it becomes your turn to be the Wagon Master for a campout; the following are some easy guidelines for planning and items to be sure you have included.

Sign up for a month. Pick a month that will be convenient for you. Remember, our campouts are generally held on the first full weekend (Friday-Sunday) However; during the week is also good since rates may be cheaper.

Get a co-wagonmaster. Most campouts should have one co-wagonmaster. If you haven't done a campout before; get someone who has to be your co-wagonmaster/mentor.

Choose a location (we will generally travel as much as 4 – 6 hours and get specifics about the campground. Cost, discounts and extras, hookups: 30/50, cable, clubhouse, activities in area

Make the reservation. Plan on between 10-15 rigs (except for the February outing, that is our Birthday Party and we have many more)

Don't forget the details. We normally want a clubhouse for playing cards and games until 11:00 pm. Breakfast and meeting on Saturday, possible potluck dinner if you like. Make the deposit. The Treasurer will send a check or you can make it and the club will reimburse you. Get a cancellation date required for a full refund and ask when you have to get the actual number of attendees to the park.

Send the campout information to the newsletter editor as soon as possible with as much information as you can.

Plan a tentative agenda. Traditionally wagonmasters provide breakfast on Saturday (rolls, muffins, fruit, you name it) Keep it simple! Will you have hors-d'oeuvres and happy hour camaraderie? Generally we have one dinner either out, catered or a potluck. If the Wagon Master wants to provide an extraordinary breakfast or additional meals, a reasonable charge to cover expenses is okay.

Call the VP (Head Wagon Master) to keep him/her informed and if you have any questions.

Get the supplies from the preceding Wagon Master. Coffee pots, etc.

And last but not least come and have fun – IT REALLY ISN'T AS HARD AS IT SOUNDS !!!!!!!
